## **Course Highlights**

# **CRJ 101—Introduction to Criminal Justice**

Students receive an overview of the criminal justice system from arrest through the parole process. The primary elements of police, courts, and corrections are examined, along with how the secondary influences of politics, media, and public opinion influence policy and practice. Focus on juvenile justice, racism, and the Constitution.

# CRJ 210—Policing in the United States

The role of police culture, career opportunities, and advancement; social and legal restraints on police practices, police discretion in practice, and community policing are also discussed. Contemporary issues that police face will be examined extensively, especially the use of force and coercion, ethical problems, and violence against police.

#### **BUS 226—Principals of Marketing**

Students learn the fundamental theories and techniques of criminal investigation for law enforcement. Issues addressed include personal conduct at a crime scene, evidence, procedures and protocols, conduct of interviews and investigations, and report writing. An examination of investigative techniques during the conduction of specific felony offenses will be discussed.
