Course Highlights

MBC 209-CPT-4 Coding and Practicum

This course introduces the Current Procedural Terminology (CPT-4) coding system used to identify medical care and services provided by physicians and other health care facilities. Students are introduced to compliance and reimbursement issues related to HCFA Healthcare Common Procedural Coding System (HCPCS).

MBC 208-ICD-10 Coding and Practicum

Students are introduced to the International Classification of Disease—Clinical Modification (9th revision). This system provides codes to classify diseases, symptoms, abnormal findings, complaints, and external causes of injury or disease. Students acquire the skills and knowledge required to review medical records.

MBC 224—Advanced Medical Billing & Coding Internship

Students engage in the practical application of all skills learned in the classroom and the laboratory to a simulated coding and billing environment using the Capstone Simulation for Coding and e-Medsys Software. The second half of the course focuses on reviewing high yield topics and questions most likely encountered.
